Summer 2020 & 2021 programs canceled due to COVID-19 — courses redesigned for online delivery to ensure on-time graduation for some participants. Summer 2016 programs combined and moved The Hague by order of the provost following the Brussels terrorist attacks on March 22, 2016 — I completed all logistical and academic changes associated with this move in six weeks, including securing accommodations, arranging new excursions, itinerary development, coordination of travel, and course redesign.
